Three important things you should know about this course.

- 1. You have two years to complete this online course.

 This is a self-paced, online course delivered via our online portal, Booth Online.

 You will have a maximum of two years from enrolment to complete this course.
- 2. **100** hours of work placement is required to complete this course. To ensure that you are well equipped for the Community Services role, this qualification also includes a mandatory 100 hours of work placement.
- 3. Approximately 10 hours a week should be set aside for study. We recommend students allocate a minimum of 10 hours per week to work through the Learner Guides, online activities and assessments.

Industry Trends

Community services organisations play an important role in supporting Australia's welfare system. Organisations in this sector help to arrange care and counsel for individuals in need, including the economically disadvantaged and other vulnerable members of society, such as children and the elderly.

According to IBIS World 'Community Services in Australia Market Research Report' there was a 5.3% average industry growth from 2014-2019. Not-for-profit organisations and private enterprises in Community Services are expected to earn \$56.3 billion in 2019-20 from government funding, donations and private income and income is expected to increase at an annualised 3.2% over the five years through 2019-20.

Currently the need for Community Services are projected to continue to increase over the next five years.

Recognition of Prior Learning (RPL)



Work Placement

Work placement is a required component of the CHC52015 Diploma of Community Services. Work placement is essential in assisting the transition from application in a simulated setting to real practice and enables the development of learned skills in a supportive, professional context.

The required 100 hours must be undertaken in a suitable role in the community services field and overseen by a suitable work placement supervisor. All work placements must be approved by Eva Burrows College. Students currently working in a suitable community services role should be able to complete their placement on-the-job.

Students have the freedom to identify and pursue a work placement in an organisation of their choice. If required, Eva Burrows College's Placement Officer can work with the student to secure and coordinate a work placement. Upon successful completion of the work placement and all assessment tasks, and being deemed competent in all units, you will be awarded a Diploma of Community Services.

Requirements

Entry Requirements

There are no entry requirements for this qualification. However, in order to ensure that applicant is enrolled in the most suitable course of study they will be required to complete a pre-enrolment activity, during the Online Enrolment Application, to indicate why they wish to undertake this course.

Residential Status

This course is open to Australian residents only. Eva Burrows College is not registered to deliver training to offshore students. The eligibility of students will be confirmed during the enrolment process.

IT Requirements

Students require access to a computer and the internet to allow them to study using our online learning portal (Booth Online). Students should be competent in using a computer. In order to participate and engage in any online courses and tutorials, it is recommended that you have:

- a laptop or desktop computer (PC or Mac) with at least 2GB of RAM.
- a stable internet connection with at least 0.5 Mbit/second upload bandwidth and 1 Mbit/second download bandwidth (ADSL2 equivalent or higher). 3G mobile broadband is not recommended for video conferencing due to both speed and cost.
- a USB microphone headset or iPhone headset with built-in microphone. Using built-in laptop speakers and microphones creates problems with acoustic feedback for other participants.
- a current version of a modern web browser (Chrome, Firefox or Safari). Internet Explorer (IE) is not recommended, and while it will likely work, IE users may not be able to make use of all features.
- the Microsoft Office Suite installed on your computer. MS Word is required for most of the assessment tasks.

Individuals may also have responsibility for the supervision of other workers and volunteers and/or case management, program coordination or the development of new opportunities within the sector. How many hours a week will I need to spend on study? This course is delivered online, which means you can complete it at your own pace, in your own time. As a guide, we recommend students allocate a minimum of 10 hours per week to their studies.

You can fast-track your studies and graduate sooner if you wish or take time so you can focus on work or family commitments. To help you stay on track and complete your course in time you will be provided with a suggested Study Schedule Guide upon enrolment.

Is the qualification recognised nationally?

Is there financial assistance available for Salvation Army Officers or employees?

- Officers may apply for up to 90% of the course fee.
- Employees may apply for up to 60% of their course fee.

Can I access government funding for this course? Limited government subsidised places are available through the NSW and Victorian state governments. To check your eligibility, contact the Course Coordinator.

Would a VET Student Loan be available for this course? Eva Burrows College is not registered to provide VET Student Loans.

Are there payment plans available for this course? On prior arrangement, we offer a monthly payment plan, over a maximum of ten months.

Does the course fee include GST? Nationally recognised training delivered by Eva Burrows College is not subject to GST.

When do I have to pay for the Course? A non-refundable 10% deposit (first instalment) is required at time of enrolment. Full payment is required before commencement of the course unless you have a pre-approved, monthly payment plan.

If I withdraw from the course do, I get my money back? If you withdraw from a course, a partial refund may be applicable as per the conditions below. Please contact your Course Coordinator to discuss individual circumstances.

Step 2 Fill out the online Enrolment Application

Complete the Online Enrolment Application and upload the requested documents. Note; you need to provide the following on your application.

- A requirement of the federal government, when applying for a
 nationally accredited vocational training program is to provide your
 Unique Student Identifier (USI) on your Enrolment Form. Applying for
 a USI is cost free and will give you access to your training records
 and transcripts which can be accessed online, anytime and
 anywhere. To apply for a USI number or for more information, please
 visit the Australian Government USI website.
- You will be required to complete a pre-enrolment activity, during the Online Enrolment Application process, to indicate why you wish to undertake this course.

Step 3 We'll be in contact

Your enrolment application will be reviewed, and you will be informed of the outcome via email. If successful we will include an invoice for Course Fees.

Step 4Finalise Your Application

Confirm you want to go ahead with your enrolment with the Course Coordinator (via return email) and pay your course fees before commencement. For payment options, refer to the invoice forwarded to you via email or contact the Course Coordinator to discuss payment options. Note that enrolment is not confirmed until fees have been paid as agreed.

Step 5Begin Studying
