ACADEMIC INTEGRITY

Generative Artificial Intelligence

'Students may not submit work derived from Generative Artificial Intelligence (AI) tools such as ChatGPT. The only exception to this is when the assessment task is specifically designed to assess and evaluate such tools. The data produced from Generative AI is presently unreliable and known to

produce errors of fact. The presentation of Al-generated text as if it were one's own work is quite easily detected and is a serious act of academic misconduct (even if referenced in footnotes). The purpose of all assessment tasks is to assist learners to develop the capacities required to critically analyse and assess ideas, and to construct arguments of their own as independent thinkers. These skills are only developed through engagement with the work of human authors. Assistance with grammatical construction only, through such software as Grammarly is allowable but the student must disclose this use within their written work. 'Grammarly GO' however, should be treated the same as ChatGPT above. If you have used Grammarly please acknowledge this in a footnote at the start of your assessment task.
