Use the following pages or draw three columns on a piece of paper.


Column 1 is what you expected 2020 to be like. You might want to consider your ministry, family, travel, relationships, recreation, special occasions, schooling/education and so on.


Column 2 is what you've experienced instead, due to COVID-19.
